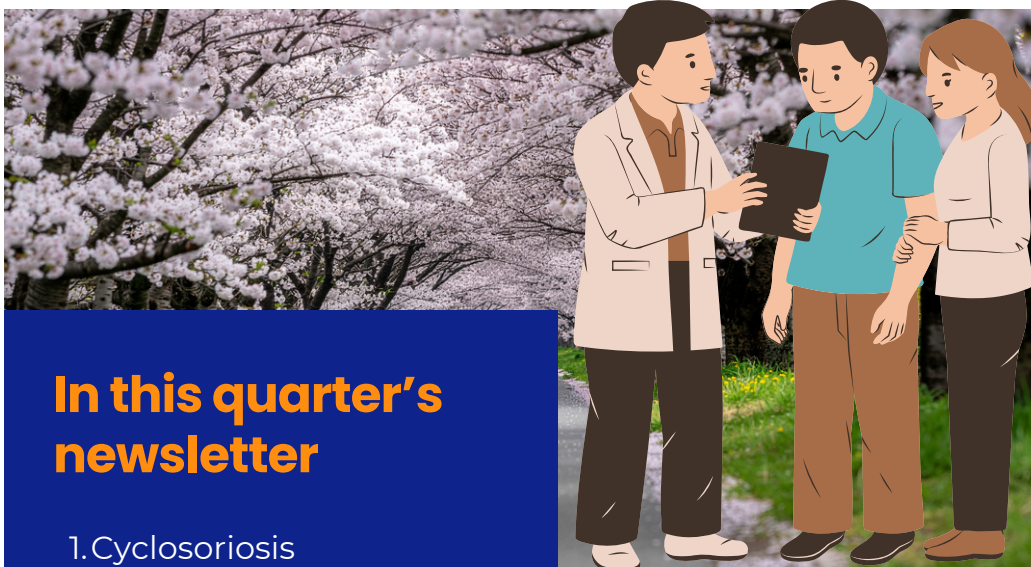

Cyclosporiosis

The outbreak of cyclosporiasis continues. This is an intestinal illness that causes severe diarrhea in people. The biggest risk to patients is dehydration due to decreased fluid intake and frequent watery stools.



Cyclosporiasis is a parasite that is found in stool and is usually transmitted from eating fresh unwashed fruits and vegetables. Symptoms usually begin 7-14 days after infection.

With the warm weather comes different issues. Including ticks. We have already seen an increase of tick activity in the area

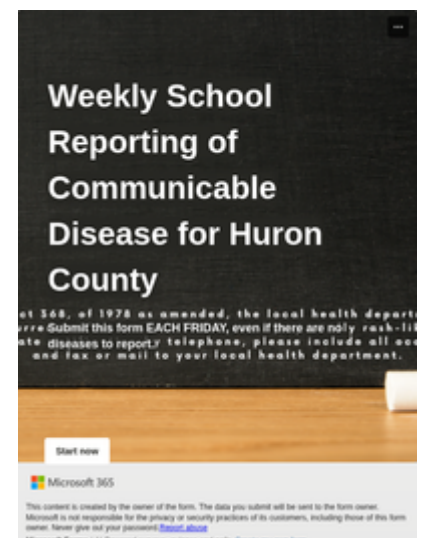
Call your PCP or local health department for more information on ticks.
